#### 5. NEW BUSINESS

#### a) City of Igaluit 2020 Financial Statements

Alison Drummond, Senior Director of Corporate Services, reviewed the City of Iqaluit's 2020 Audited Financial Statements. The following are the highlights:

- Despite the challenges encountered because of COVID-19, the City maintained an overall positive financial position, will all funds being in a positive position.
- The City closed out 2020 in a positive position, which is the first time since 2013.
- The City flowed through:
  - o \$659,000 in COVID-19 specific funding to community organizations
  - o \$1.5 million under the Reaching Home Program
  - o \$382,000 under the Community Wellness Program
- Overall expenditures for 2020 was \$7 million less than 2019.
- Doubtful Accounts is \$1.2 million. Most of this is related to property tax and the by-law to write off a lot of owed accounts receivables.
- Positive change in the accumulated fund balance, which is up \$17.4 million over 2019.
- Reserve account has \$21,284,694 for capital projects.
- General Operating Fund revenue was \$1.1 million over 2019 and \$500,000 over the 2020 budget.
- The following departments recorded saving on expenditures due to:
  - o Budgets were based on all positions being filled, however, there were unused budget salaries for unfilled positions.
  - o Careful scheduling and curbing of unnecessary overtime
  - o Careful monitoring of all expenditures
  - o Decrease in over budget purchasing
  - Recreation Department shutting down the major recreation facilities due to COVID-19 protocols
  - o Recreation Department redeployment of staffing during COVID-19
- Overview of departments:
  - o General government services were \$1.1 million under budget
  - o Emergency services always schedules a loss situation, however, the loss was \$1.2 million less than projected
  - o By-law enforcement schedules for a loss situation, however, the loss was \$500,000 less than projected
  - o Public Works and Transportation were \$1.2 million under budget
  - o Recreation had a loss of \$200,000 less than projected

## o Engineering was \$400,000 under budget

Councillor Fawcett asked for an explanation on doubtful accounts receivables.

Shawn Lester, Lester Landau, explained that doubtful accounts receivables is an allowance that is set up as some receivables will not be paid.

Councillor Stevenson commented that this is a positive financial position and the City has moved forward from struggling financially, to now being secure.
