5. **STATEMENTS**

Councillor Akumalik believed that the city should recognize and appreciate Yvonne Iyago who was recently promoted as Sergeant with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police; she has been a long term resident of Iqaluit and serves her community well. He also recognized the Iqaluit bantam hockey team who won

the gold medal during their tournament in Ottawa, ON and congratulated them for their winning. He thanked the staff of Qulliq Energy Corporation for their time and effort during the recent blizzard; they worked long hours in very cold temperatures to address the power outage issues.

Councillor Morrissey stated that he will be resigning as Councillor for the City of Iqaluit and his last meeting will be February 11, 2014; an opportunity has arisen for him and his family that they could not pass. It was a very hard decision to make and thanked everyone for their support.

Councillor Bell thanked Councillor Morrissey for his efforts and dedication to Council, city staff and residents of Iqaluit and stated that all his expertise has been much appreciated. He stated that the bantam hockey team won the gold medal during the tournament in Ottawa, ON and the midget team won second place at the same time; he congratulated both teams for their winnings.

He noted that a motion was passed by Council requesting to receive a copy of two reports relating to the old swimming pool and these have yet to be received. He stated that he would like to receive an update on the matter as soon as possible.

He stated that a long time resident and former Council member, Mr. Bob Hanson had an unfortunate event during the Christmas holidays where his grand-daughter's presents were accidentally thrown to the curb with other waste to be picked up by the Public Works Department; public works staff was contacted on Christmas Day by Mr. and Mrs. Hanson stating what had happened and staff were kind enough to bring them to the landfill the following day and assist them in retrieving all gifts, undamaged. The family was very thankful and believed that this was truly a Christmas miracle.

Councillor Dobbin noted that he will be attending the 2014 Northern Lights Tradeshow along with Councillor Morrissey, Mayor Graham and John Hussey, Chief Administrative Officer, and believed that the city should approach Government of Canada officials to seek funding assistance for important infrastructure projects.

He stated that there are several large snow piles throughout the community that are very dangerous and suggested that Municipal Enforcement visit the property owners to request that the snow be removed from the property before an accident occurs.

 - i) Public Hearing for General Plan Amendment No. 760 and Zoning By-law Amendment No. 761

Administration noted that no representations were made during the Public Hearing; therefore, no ruling is required.

b) Request for Decision – Development Permit Application 13-068

Jaime Posen, Contract Planner

Administration stated that the applicant, BDL Properties, has applied for a development permit to build (2) two-storey, six-unit row dwellings on Lot 40, Plan 3604. Lot 40 is a through lot with frontage on Pingua Street and on Qaqqaliaq Street. The lot is located in Phase 1 of the Plateau Subdivision and is currently vacant.

The majority of the row dwelling units have south-facing building entrances which front on Qaqqaliaq Street and onto a shared parking area. The entrances to the end units are located along the side of the buildings. Wind screens will be provided to reduce wind effects at these entrances. The majority of parking is located along Qaqqaliaq Street. This parking area consists of ten resident parking spaces and two visitor parking spaces. One disabled space is provided. One parking space is located in the yard fronting on Pingua Street. The fourteen (14) parking spaces meet the required minimum in the Zoning By-law.

Two special conditions of approval are required for this development prior to issuance of the development permit. Firstly, the applicant needs to identify an outdoor amenity space on the lot pursuant to the requirements of the Residential Cluster Zone. The eastern portion of the lot abutting the vacant Open Space Zone is the recommended preferred location. The amenity space could consist of a sitting area or active play area. Secondly, there is currently a portion of the building where the gap to allow wind flow is inadequate. This may cause snow drifting in the parking area or along Qaqqaliaq Street. The applicant must revise the elevations to increase the gap under the buildings.
