
Statement from Mayor Bell:

"City Councillors are held accountable to following the City's code of conduct and human rights and anti-harassment policy. Council will be discussing this together at the next City Council meeting and will take this opportunity to look at additional ways to educate council on racism, biases, and other social discrimination.
