2. <u>SPECIAL BUSINESS</u>

BY-LAWS

a) First Reading of By-law(s)

i) Public Cannabis Consumption, Smoking and Vaping By-law

Amy Elgersma, Acting CAO, advised that the by-law being presented today is the Public Cannabis Consumption, Smoking and Vaping By-law. Ms. Elgersma provided the following background information:

- Federal Government Bill C45 to legalize recreational cannabis comes into effect October 17, 2018.
- Government of Nunavut Bill 7 *Cannabis Act* and Regulations has set minimum standards and rules for cannabis consumption.
- The act, along with the *Cities, Towns and Villages Act* allows municipalities to define how cannabis will be consumed in communities by allowing each municipality the ability to add further restrictions to the standards.
- Council has directed staff to draft a by-law to address public consumption and to review the smoking by-law.
- Territorial legislation:
 - o Prohibits anyone ages 18 and under from consuming and possessing cannabis.
 - Prohibits anyone from providing cannabis or cannabis accessories to a minor.
 - The federal act permits a legal age person to possess up to 30 grams on their person.
 - Government of Nunavut specifies that the overall amount of dried cannabis a person can have in their possession is 150 grams (this is interpreted as being the amount that is kept at home)
 - O No one is permitted to sell cannabis in Iqaluit.
 - Government of Nunavut's Liquor and Cannabis Commission will provide information on how to purchase cannabis from licensed vendors by online ordering.
 - Restricts cannabis consumption within nine metres of an entrance or exit from:
 - A hospital or other health facility, including grounds.
 - A school, including grounds.
 - A childcare facility or childcare service, including grounds.
 - A playground.
 - A sports field or playing field.
 - An arena.
 - A community hall.
 - A recreation centre.

- A public place where goods and services are sold or otherwise provided to the public (does not include a cannabis lounge).
- A parade, concert or other public event.
- Any other public place that is prescribed or otherwise described in the regulations.
- Under the act, no person shall smoke any substance in any manner or place including:
 - The dwelling of a person if it could be expected to result in smoke entering, by smell or sight, in a workplace or public place.
 - The common area of an apartment.
 - A dwelling of another person who has not consented to the smoking.
- No person shall smoke in a motor vehicle in a public place or within public view.
- At this time, the Government of Nunavut has not prohibited plants at home, but the act allows them to regulate plants. There is a question if the Government of Nunavut can impose restrictions on plants at home.
- Smoking outdoors is permitted, providing it is nine metres from where the smoke or vapour could enter the workplace or dwelling.
- The City will be enforcing its own by-law.
- An inspector from the Government of Nunavut may request the assistance of a municipal enforcement officer in enforcing the act or regulations, the conditions of a license, or the terms of a contract and give instructions for that purpose.
- If a Municipal Enforcement Officer suspects the operator of a motor vehicle to be intoxicated, at this time, the officer will contact the RCMP to respond.
- The City's by-law purpose is to:
 - o Regulate public consumption of cannabis, smoking and vaping in the City.
 - Recognize that there is health risks associated with smoking, environmental tobacco smoke and the risks associated with secondary smoke.
 - The smoke or vapour produced by smoking or vaping of tobacco, cannabis and other substances in public places can be a nuisance for the other persons in those public places.
- The by-law combines restrictions of cannabis use and replaces the City's current Smoking By-law No. 570.
- Smoking By-law No. 570 will be repealed.
- The by-law increases the distance from nine metres to 15 metres from any entrance or exit from a school, including the grounds.
- The by-law includes the provision to prohibit the use of cannabis and smoking at a public assembly.

Ms. Elgersma advised that Ed Gullberg from McLennan Ross is participating in the meeting via teleconference and assisted in drafting the by-law.
